# Welcome,

**Welcome!** Welcome to Camp Meriwether, which some have referred to as the flagship of CPC's camps. Welcome also to Discovery Lodge, named by Scouts, and truly linked to the Lewis & Clark expedition. Also located on this property is a unique, authentic, replica of Fort Clatsop.

Today we celebrate the conclusion of a volunteer vision – similar to the vision of President Thomas Jefferson, Meriwether Lewis and William Clark as they started their journey in 1803. What a journey it was, and what a profound difference it made for our nation. The Louisiana Purchase, linking East to West, and the realization of the resources along the Columbia River, changed America.

In a similar vein, the Lewis & Clark Year of Discovery program, created and envisioned by Scouting volunteers and others, has had a profound impact on young people and adults. Participants have included individuals from Oregon, Washington, Idaho, California, Utah, Virginia, and Germany!

More than six thousand journals were purchased, and the following awards earned:

- 1200 Bronze – one highlight requirement: research, plan and take a 5-mile hike along the Lewis & Clark Trail in the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area
- 800 Silver – a highlight: visit the Lewis & Clark Interpretive Center and the Cape Disappointment Lighthouse
- 750 Gold – Research, plan and visit Fort Clatsop, Astoria, Oregon. Take the 5-mile hike starting at Fort Clatsop to the ocean beach.
- 707 Presidential – one highlight was to visit the Lewis & Clark Discovery Center at Hell's Gate State Park in Lewiston, Idaho.



In earning these awards, young people (today's explorers), had to use new skills and gain new knowledge. They made new friends, traveled to new places, yet had experiences similar to those of Lewis and Clark.

# Recognition

## PRESIDENT THOMAS JEFFERSON (PHILLIP FOLEEN)

After graduating from Valley Catholic High School in Beaverton Oregon, Phillip pursued his dream of the theatre in New York by attending Adelphi University on Long Island. A member of the Honors College, Phillip graduated Cum Laude in 1999 with a double degree in Performance and Technical Theatre. Currently Phillip is Assistant Technical Director in the Performing Arts Department of Adelphi University and contracts with technical crews in the off-Broadway theatres during his weekends.

## CAPT. MERIWETHER LEWIS (DAVE SCOTT) & CAPT. WILLIAM CLARK (TOM WILSON)

Dave Scott – Captain Meriwether Lewis – is a resident of Seattle, Washington where he lives with his wife and daughter and manages an office of 15. Dave has been a lover of history throughout his life, so the opportunity to do historical re-enactment was second nature. Dave portrays two characters; Captain Meriwether Lewis and George Gibson from the “Saltworks” program.

Tom Wilson – Captain William Clark, is a resident of Astoria, Oregon where he lives with his wife, Debbie and daughter, Kari. They also have one older daughter, Stephanie. Tom is currently in his 29th year of teaching elementary school in Astoria. Tom has portrayed several different members, but currently portrays Captain William Clark and William Bratton (Saltworks)

Tom became very interested in Lewis and Clark when he began working with Fort Clatsop on their curriculum advisory board, helping to write and edit curriculum. Later volunteering as a ranger in various roles.

In 2001, Ft. Clatsop began the living history programs which started with the “Saltworks” in Seaside. That same year Tom and Dave reenacted “Wintering Over” at the Fort. He has participated in every program since that time.

In 2004, in order To grow and expand the concept of “living history” Tim and Dave formed the Pacific North West Living Histories a living historian group. The programs they and their members present are first-person re-enactments of the Lewis and Clark Expedition experiences.

**SEAMAN** is portrayed by “Dolly.” She is a 5 year old Newfoundland owned by Bob and Rae Zimmerling of Gearhart, Oregon. Dolly was rescued by Bob who is a volunteer at Astoria’s animal shelter. Dolly is seen in the documentary, “A Clatsop Winter Story” along with Tom and Dave as the captains.



# Recognition

## HONOR GUARD

Members of the Lewis & Clark Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution serve as our Honor Guard carrying historic flags flown during our country's infancy.

The Sons of the American Revolution are documented direct descendents of Revolutionary War Patriots. Their uniforms are replicas of the 1784 style infantry uniforms worn by the First American Regiment. This uniform pattern was approved by George Washington in 1782 for wear by all infantry units in the Continental Army. It consists of a blue coat faced with a red collar, cuffs and lapels, with long tight-fitting overalls and a black cockaded tricorn hat. The historic flags used today in the ceremony are from the collection a member of the Lewis & Clark Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution.

## STANLEY WANLASS, SCULPTOR

The bronze sculpture, "Arrival", created by Mr. Wanlass is depicted on the front image on the Bronze, Silver and Gold medals. This sculpture is currently on display at Ft Clatsop at the Oregon Coast.

Mr. Wanlass an internationally acclaimed sculptor and painter of historical monuments, is currently residing in Sandy, Utah. Mr. Wanlass is a former university professor in the United States as well as at the European Art Academy in Paris and the University of Grenoble, France.

As a former resident of Astoria, Oregon, Mr. Wanlass studied the Lewis & Clark Expedition in depth. Best known for his bronzes, the Pacific Northwest is honored to have three of his larger than life bronzes – one of Lewis & Clark at the turnaround in Seaside, the second at Ft. Clatsop and the third in Long Beach, Washington.

## GEORGE LUNDEEN, SCULPTOR

The front of the Presidential Medal is a depiction of the bronze sculpture, "On the Trail of Discovery" created by Mr Lundeen.

Residing in Colorado, this renowned artist and sculptor was pupil of Mr. Stanley Wanlass as well as being a Fulbright-Hayes Scholar studying at the Academia de Belle Arte in Florence, Italy. He holds a masters in Fine Arts from the University of Illinois and a bachelor of arts from Hastings College in Nebraska. Mr. Lundeen is a member of the National Academy of Design and the National Sculpture Society.

# Recognition

## KARL SPRAGUE, ARTIST/DESIGNER

Mr. Sprague is Asst SM in Troop 60, charter representative for Crew 5, Cascade Pacific Council, artist and illustrator, designed the original artwork for the patches used in the Year of Discovery awards program. Two designs were created, one that was used for the green-bordered Council shoulder patch, the three medal levels and the red-bordered Ft. Clatsop Special Dedication patch. Mr. Sprague also designed the Presidential Level patch depicting Lewis and Clark in a canoe with a 15 star United States flag in the background.

## PAUL GILLUM, SCULPTOR

Originally from Chicago, artist Paul R. Gillum now calls Astoria, Oregon home. Paul has a talent for creating fine art with a distinctly whimsical and impressionistic flair. Having succeeded as an oil painter from the early age of 15, Mr. Gillum began to study sculpture in 1986. He was trained and guided by his teacher Mr. Stanley Wanlass (sculptor of Fort Clatsop's "Arrival" statue). Mr. Gillum's interest and talent in the use of bronze was shaped in part by the two men working closely together. The Ft. Clatsop bookstore displays his two bronzes "Reflection" and "A Moment in Time", both depicting Sacagawea. In 1987 Paul opened his own studio, "Studio B", dealing exclusively in fine art bronze sculpture. Mr. Gillum also created "Destination: The Pacific" a limited edition bronze sculpture depicting Lewis and Clark navigating white water in a birch bark canoe.

## GRAY WOLF

Gray Wolf's ancestry includes Northern Cheyenne of the Great Plains and Micmac of the Northeast. He has traveled the country for many years in search of knowledge from his people, living in his tipi for extended periods of time. He spent time on several reservations, learning what he could of lifeways from tribal elders and others. He is a professional guide for canoe trips, horsepacking, kayaking, backpacking and prospecting. Gray Wolf also teaches rock-climbing and survival skills. His real-life experience gives him a solid platform from which to share his knowledge of Native Americans, Mountain Men, Cowboys, wilderness survival and all that these entail.

## CLEAR WATER RIVER COMPANY

Jim Cook, President of the Clearwater River Company, Clearwater River, Idaho bought his company in 1993 after guiding fishing trips on the Clearwater River for 10 years. Having attended college in Nebraska, Pennsylvania and Florida he moved to Idaho in 1974. Jim found his "home" when he moved to Clearwater country to work full time in the business he loved. Jim Cook and Lois Hansen, along with Gray Wolf, played pivotal roles as part of the high adventure "Journey of Discovery" of those striving to earn the Presidential Award.
